INFORMATION AND AGREEMENTS

1. RQU Bible Camp will be held at the Coulee City Last Stand Rodeo Grounds in Coulee City, WA on Thursday June 20th– Sunday, June 23, 2019 for girls 8-24 years of age. You will receive expert instruction, accommodations, delicious meals, and entertainment, see attached schedule. Limited stalls are available, overnight trailer tie IS NOT permitted due to safety issues campers must provide their own panels and must feed, water, clean horse area each day. Students may bring one horse for their event, however, they need to also have some on premises to help with their horse. **Bringing your own horse IS NOT mandatory.** Cost for each applicant is \$200.00, due with application by June 1, 2019. A MAXIMUM OF 60 CAMPERS WILL BE TAKEN! REGISTER EARLY!
2. All participants must show proof of insurance before being admitted to camp. **IF YOU ARE ON MEDICATION YOU NEED TO ALERT STAFF AT REGISTRATION!!**
3. Check in for RQBC is Thursday, June 20, 2019 between 10:00-11:00PM for SENIOR girls, and Friday June 21, 2019 between 10:00-11:00 AM for JUNIOR girls. **LET'S BE ON TIME!!!** At check in you will receive your schedule. No one is allowed to leave the camp once they have checked in (Emergencies excluded, by the discretion of Jamie Dearing).
4. All campers are required to participate in all scheduled activities, including riding horses. Our camper's safety is our greatest concern. We will be with each camper as they improve their skills. We will also be with those to help gain confidence and conquer any fears.
5. Upon arrival, go to registration desk. **ONLY** participants, parents and volunteers that are signed up and checked in may attend RQBC, due to insurance issues.
6. **CELL PHONES WILL BE COLLECTED AT REGISTRATION AND LEFT IN A LOCK BOX DURING CAMP TO ENSURE THAT STUDENTS ARE GETTING THE MOST OUT OF THEIR CAMP EXPERIENCE.** STAFF WILL HAVE CELL PHONES FOR CAMPERS TO CALL FOR EMERGENCIES.
7. Showers and all personal hygiene must be completed at scheduled time **ONLY**. ALL CAMPERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SHOWER ONCE DAILY!!!
8. All stock must be cared for by the campers prior to breakfast, lunch and dinnertime, each day, we do not have staff to do this for you. **IF YOUR HORSE IS NOT PROPERLY CARED FOR, YOU WILL BE SENT HOME WITHOUT A REFUND. ANIMAL WELFARE IS TOP PRIORITY!**

9. **NO CAMPERS ARE ALLOWED IN THE KITCHEN AT ANY TIME!**
10. **CAMPERS AND STAFF WILL WAIT TO BEGIN EATING UNTIL GRACE HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR EVERY MEAL.** MEAL TIME IS MEAL TIME, WE ALL EAT TOGETHER – NO STRAGGLERS.
11. Every person eating in the Cowgirl Café will sign in prior to each meal so we have a proper accounting.
12. Please invite family and friends to the mock pageant on Sunday, June 23rd at 10:00AM. Lunch will be served, RSVP is encouraged so we know how many meals to prepare.
13. **NO DOGS ALLOWED**, due to insurance issues.
14. We ask that parents trust us to take the most excellent care of your child. We ask that you stay for orientation on Friday and return to camp on Sunday to join us for the Mock Pageant. We have found through the years your camper will have the best experience when parents and grandparents aren't at camp, so the camper can focus on camp and create new relationships with camp staff and campers. There are hotels in the area as well as campgrounds for you to enjoy some quiet time as well as indulge in the amazing recreation opportunities in the area.
15. The sleeping area provided for campers **ONLY**. All campers are required to **camp on-site in bunk areas unless previously approved by Jamie Dearing.**
16. **ABSOLUTELY NO BULLYING OR "MEAN GIRL ATTITUDES" WILL BE PERMITTED. All conflicts will be resolved immediately and reported to Stanley & Jamie Rauch. If these attitudes continue to persist the camper creating the conflict will be sent home immediately! THERE IS NO TOLERANCE FOR SUCH BEHAVIOR!**
17. ALL CAMPERS WILL HAVE THEIR BOTTOMS IN THEIR SEATS FOR CHAPEL SERVICE BEFORE THE SONG "GIRLS JUST WANT TO HAVE FUN" IS COMPLETED. Each camper will agree to sit by someone new during every class, chapel, and meal in order to make friends with everyone!
18. Camp will end following the baptism service AND CAMP CLEAN UP directly after. We must have the building and the arena completely clean no later than 4:00pm
